### Encountering the Risen Lord

- Organize Parish Picnics, Parish Festivals, Open Houses and invite the public.
- Add programs at All Saints School such as:
  - Robotics Team
  - Physical Education Teacher
  - School Counselor-Maybe connected to Catholic Human Services
  - Music Teacher
- Welcome New Parishioners by matching them with current members
- Yearly Newcomers gathering
- Welcome and minister to the divorced and remarried
- Community Sports Area to promote young families being together.
- Day Care and After School Services offering Faith Formation to children.
- Expand the Preschool program
- Youth program that provides safe space to be and someone to talk to- small group discipleship programs
- Small groups for faith sharing, bible study, etc.
- Make young families a priority, help them be connected to Parish life

### Being transformed by God's Grace

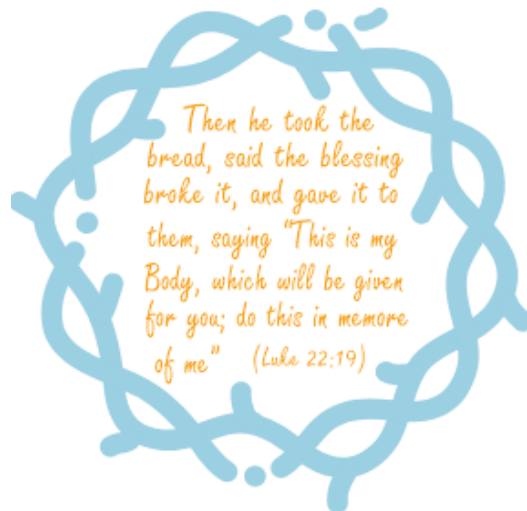
- Sunday School for small children during Mass

- Have a place where people can have the dignity of getting cleaned (showers, laundry)
- Educating and promoting what we offer the community for those in need spiritually and physically. Connect all we do as Catholics in the community.
- Homilies and teachings on living our faith in word and deed.
- Ease of access for all of our charitable outreach
- Support of Friendship Room ministry
- Moving Food Pantry to another location freeing up more space in current St. Vincent DePaul building. Would like to have near DHHS so recipients can "shop" without finding transportation.
- A Charity Committee to help coordinate and organize all efforts.
- Apply for Grants to help bring these ministries together in one location.
- Emergency shelter for just a few nights as a stop gap for the Sunrise Mission and other community shelters
- Woman's shelter
- Invite those who are served in some fashion by the Parish to Sunday worship
- Signs and Advertising letting the whole community know about the charitable ministries of the Catholic Church in Alpena



## -Facilities-

### St. Anne Campus



- Church built in 1896
- Church burned in the 1910's
- New Parish center and offices built in 2006 (debt still owed)
- Rectory and School torn down in 2017 and new parking lots added.
- Bishop designated St. Anne Church the Parish of All Saints Parish
- 28,442 square feet- 100% used

### St. Bernard Campus



- Church built in 1882
- Elementary School built in 1962
- Rectory used as the Madonna House
- Convent sold in 2010's
- Primary use: Friendship Room, Baby Pantry, Children's Closet, Madonna House, AA, occasional use of the church for Funerals and Weddings
- 31,166 square feet- 20% used

### St. John Campus



- School/Church built in 1960's
- New Church built in 1999 (debt still owe)
- Rectory built in 1990's and sold in 2010's
- Primary use: Faith Formation, Youth Ministry, Knights of Columbus. Occasional use for Funerals and Weddings.
- 53,053 square feet- 20% used

### St. Mary Campus



- Church built in 1889
- Elementary school built in 1962
- Rectory built in 1915 by priests Currently
- Convent built in 1957 goes unused
- Primary use: School, Adoration, Occasional use for Funerals and Weddings
- 43,015 square feet- 80% used

### Holy Cross Cemetery



- Chapel built in 1965
- Garage built in 1965
- 37 Acres
- 4,329 square feet- 70% used
